Soho's got game

COULD there be anything better on a frosty December night than holing up in a snug pub with a pint? Well, what about holing up in a snug pub with a pint and juicy venison burger? Or a venison chateaubriand? Or deep-fried pheasant or rabbit hot-wings?

Street-food superstars The Wild Game Co have moved inside for a few months for a residency at equally cool Berwick Street boozer The Endurance, to bring Scottish game to the heart of London's Soho. The company started two years ago, when founder Andy Waugh, 29, who comes from a

family of game butchers in the north of Scotland, turned his back on a career in finance to follow his passion - food.

'I really wanted to get people excited about game and teach them not to be scared of it,' he says. 'But also to get them to reconnect with their food, to show that pheasants come with feathers, they were walking around yesterday - that meat doesn't come in a plastic bag.'

With chef Ruaridh Emslie, Waugh set up a stall at Broadway Market, followed by stalls at Whitecross and Berwick Street Markets, where shoppers can buy a burger to eat with a cut of meat to take home and

cook themselves. The Evening Standard has named their stalls one of the top five places to eat game in London. With a colourful and creative menu that changes daily, the Wild Game residency runs until January 31.
