Back at Sun Gardens, Dubrovnik, an even greater treat awaits in the 'Tastes for all Senses' menu. Showcasing the very best regional produce, each delicious course is matched alongside a hand-picked local wine. Among the delights on the menu, are Mediterranean shrimps coupled with Istrian black truffle, as well as fresh fillet of John Dory which comes delightfully paired with a crisp Croatian white wine.
